Exploring the Engineering Marvel: Visit to Bhakra Nangal Dam

An educational excursion to Bhakra Nangal Dam was organised on 7 September. It was a highly informative experience, offering students a first-hand understanding of one of India's most iconic infrastructure projects. It showcased the vital role played by dams in irrigation, hydroelectric power generation, and flood control and also emphasised the need for sustainable water management. This visit bridged the gap between theoretical knowledge and real-world application, giving students an in-depth appreciation of large-scale infrastructure and its impact on the economy and environment.

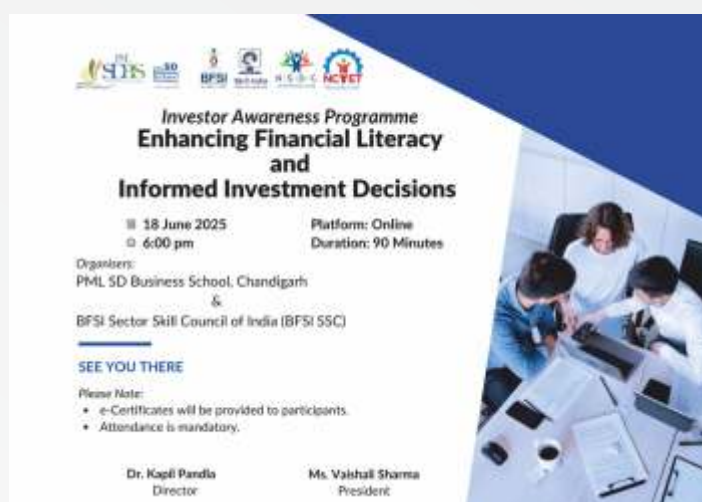
Success of crowd pulling Exhibit at Riwayat'2025

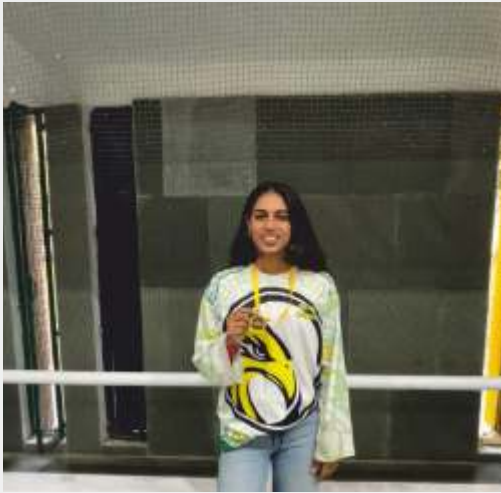
